Sociological theories offer a range of explanations, views and concepts to explain different social phenomena, for example, how society works, why crime exists, ideas on poverty or the role of youth in today's society. They are a core component of the A level course. Familiarizing yourself with these will be a strong foundation for study.

(Symbolic) Interactionism, Functionalism, Conflict theory (Marxism), Postmodernism. You will need to include specialist words such as consensus, conflict, ideology... for the relevant viewpoints, but don't

let it put you off (sociology is full of them) and you can always use the guide to define/explain what they mean.

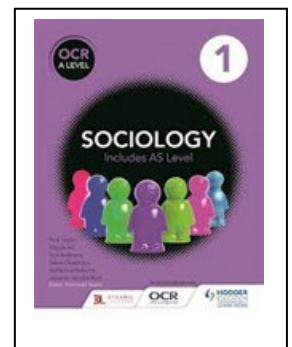
