Headline Information

- The percentage of school leavers meeting the duty to participation (in full time education, training, apprenticeships and full time employment with education) continues to remain higher than the county average.
- The vast majority of our students continue on to full time education and attend a range of Post 16 providers.
- The percentage of students who go on to participate on apprenticeships schemes in 2023 has risen for the first time since 2020. This is a testament to our work over the last few years on raising the profile of apprenticeships.
- The schools NEET percentage (those students not in education, employment of training) has been consistently below the county and national average suggesting that students are well informed and make appropriate choices.
