

International Women's Day (IWD) is a global day celebrating the social, economic, cultural, and political achievements of women. The day also marks a call to action for accelerating gender parity. Significant activity is witnessed worldwide as groups come together to celebrate women's achievements or rally for women's equality.

IWD is marked annually on March 8th, to:

- celebrate women's achievements
- educate and awareness raise about women's equality
- call for positive change advancing women
- lobby for accelerated gender parity
- fundraise for women-focused charities

International Women's Day has occurred for well over a century with the first gathering held in 1911.

IWD is an official holiday in many countries including: Afghanistan, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Burkina Faso, Cambodia, China (for women only), Cuba, Georgia, Guinea-Bissau, Eritrea, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Laos, Madagascar (for women only), Moldova, Mongolia, Montenegro, Nepal (for women only), Russia, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Uganda, Ukraine, Uzbekistan, Vietnam, and Zambia.

"We do as many lunchtimes as we like as there is no set time. When we get there, we are handed our grabbers and rubbish bags and we get as much rubbish in the bag as we can during lunchtime."

"Sometimes we are also given chocolate and house points for doing it, which is nice."
When I asked him about why he thought litter picking is so important in our school, he answered "Sometimes people just can't be bothered to put their rubbish in the bins because they don't want to go and look for one; which doesn't help. In a way we are doing it for them-even though it can be difficult sometimes it does help keep our school clean; and hopefully with me helping out I can try and get others involved with it too."

So there you have it! With our band of litter pickers helping tackle our litter issue, we can only hope that soon others will come and join them in an effort to keep Thomas Adams clean and welcoming.

This year, world book day was held on a different day that was March 7th as normally it's held on April 23rd, the day of William




WORLD BOOK DAY
